Help Session (Technical, Mechanical & Emotional)

We would like to see as large a field of cars as possible running in Formula Classic this year, if anyone is struggling to get their car ready for the 2020 season there is plenty of help available within FCR. Several members have offered to assist with access to their workshop, equipment, tools and expertise. If you do need some help / guidance please contact the FCR Secretary and we will do our very best to get you safely back on track.

Rain Lights

There has been a revision to the rain light requirements for 2020 season, below is an extract the technical regulations regarding this change;

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF AUTOMOBILES in 2019 (now mandatory in 2020)

Schedule C

(a) A rearward facing red warning lamp, acting as a rain light, must be clearly visible from the rear and mounted not more than 100mm from the centreline of the car. Each lamp must:

(i) be of at least 15 watts, or an LED lamp with FIA or CAMS approval may be used and may strobe; and

(ii) have a minimum surface area of 20cm2 and a maximum surface area of 140cm2; and

(iii) be able to be switched on by the driver when normally seated in the car.

The car was imported into Australia in 2007 and ran in South Australia prior to being sold to another owner in Queensland in early 2018.

As far as I can determine the car had several owners before being bought by Burt Curtis who restored it.

It carries a second Data Plate on the chassis stating that it was restored by "Curtis Unlimited" in 1996.

Burt had it for about 3 years before it went through several other owners including a person who apparently had it in storage for about 22 years

It is currently being tidied up in preparation for the 2020 Season.
