Qualifying saw me leaving pit lane to be immediately swamped by a host of very fast cars. This was a relatively new experience for me and forced a level of concentration and commitment which led to a sub minute lap on old tyres of which I was reasonably happy. In the old days this would have resulted in a spot at least on the first couple of rows but not now, oh no!! The result was a lowly 8<sup>th</sup> on the grid and a sharp lesson in how times have changed in Formula Classic Racing. I am delighted with this new level of competition within the group. All this whilst observing , first hand, the excellent standard of driving allowing then onaero/less powered cars to safely enjoy themselves in the midfield battles. I think that we could improve in the aspect of reliability (from me also) but recognise that our cars are old, relatively complicated and in some cases very highly tuned. A special mention must go out to the pit crews, mechanics and helpers that we have among our ranks, many thanks for all the time and support that

you provide. It is very much appreciated. Enormous thanks must also go to all the Officials and Marshalls that give freely of their time to make it possible for us to race. I hope that they are aware of our gratitude and I also hope that there are steps in place to make them better appreciated by the organisers.
